The Struggle of Black Business w/ Troy Johnson

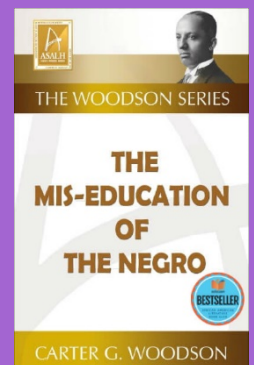
